-Frank, QSL Cards/QRZ Page. Report. Crane Fest SES operations? Half dozen contacts – bad conditions. Cinco de Mayo SES possibilities. Will update the QRZ page with the POTA's, FD, etc. Adam to do this on the web page & blog. Frankk to do FB. Bob to talk to Jim to set up outside his business for Cinco. Has an antenna.

-James, Testing/Education. Working at Police Academy on Saturdays. 2 testing so far. 4 VEC's in meeting.

-Skip-vaccines. Rio Grande Hospital. Moderna. SLV Health also. Appointment numbers. Also Mineral County in Creede.

-Phil, EMCOMM. Report. CVM credential information. <u>https://covolunteers.state.co.us/</u>. Colorado Volunteer Mobilizer. John Bloom desires to take national template and modify it to apply to CO ARES. ARES is changing. Important note. CVM does credentialing for everyone. Need to have one to identify who you are and qualified to do what you do. Key issue, you must be enrolled in CVM. Few hours course & information. Background check too. SSN too. May be of some concern. State or Fed check-unknown. No fingerprinting. Ultimately, you can't be in ARES/AUXCOMM if you don't have a background check. Don-it's a civilianized background check. If help is needed, has to go up through state EOC channels to request it. End of May, wants to have a comex exercise to determine what will work and what won't; repeaters, relays, what's needed. Having credentials will help when people from out of the area may be here to help. 4-6 people needed for Comex. Different points in different towns in RG County. Portable repeater can be set up in about 30 minutes. Other Emergency Managers in SLV are interested too. Winlink is a possibility too. Try without wifi first (Phil). ICS 100, 200, 700 training a minimum to participate (800 too). The desire is to keep people local. AUXCOMM requirement, must be willing to deploy up to 4 days...not everyone can. <u>https://www.cisa.gov/</u> Don. Communications & accountability is key. End of May for training. More next meeting.

<u>Presentation:</u> CW Academy – Phil Schechter. Presentation. Started with Hallcrafters receiver & DX 100B transmitter. Speed increases with practice. Mechanism through the classes to increase your speed. At fast speeds, you are conversing in words & sentences, not characters. CW Operators Club. Dave-QRP on SSB. 17db difference. 5 watts CW about the same as 100 watts SSB. CW still used extensively, even in contests. Typically second most used mode. Founders of CWA concerned with longevity of CW and why they founded. 4 levels of training. Beginner (just starting). No training up to 10 WPM. Paddles only, no straight keys. Classes online, usually Zoom. Paddle is not as physically taxing as a straight key. Iambic sending is squeeze sending, not for the classes though. Farnsworth – spacing between characters. Characters / letters sent at 20 wpm, but spacing makes it 5 wpm. 2nd is basic class. Up to 10 WPM. 3rd – Intermediate. 15WPM plus. Advanced-4th. 25 WPM head copy to graduate, head copy, not on paper! Google CW Academy Student Resources. All available online-free. See all of it. 3-4 sessions per year, about 1 per season. There is a waiting list to get in. Time-you need to be dedicated. Requirements 30-45 minutes a day, beginner level and goes up. Advanced 1 hour a day starting, up to 2 near end of course. Pangrams. Hard to send in code sentences. Next classes start in August. Semester is usually 18 classes, 2 months. Mon & Thu each week. Learn to adjust for spelling, etc. Many words are abbreviated.
